


Fig 1. Trends for tomato and onion prices from February to July


Tomato trends

Fig 1 above shows that tomato prices was high in February, but it followed a downward trend until April. The prices were lowest in April and May. This is probably because of a drop in supply due to the continuous rains received in January and hence prevalence of diseases. The dry spell that followed then promoted a rise in supply and drop in prices. However, price rose between May and July most likely due to effects of frost. Thus, farmers are encouraged to target the rainy season and winter for high prices as long as they control diseases and frost respectively.

Onion trends

Onion price was least in February, and it rose gradually until July. This is likely due to continuous drop in supply during the production season. Therefore, farmers are encouraged to grow varieties that can retain quality for long allowing delaying sales until supply drops and prices rise.

Cabbage trends

The graph above shows that cabbage prices fell from February to June and began to rise in July. Probably, February prices were because cabbage supply was low during the wet season because of the diseases associated. The rise in supply beyond the wet period likely the reason for the fall in price. The rise in price in July could be due to effects of frost on supply.
